Joan V. Moore, of Oxford, died at the Memorial Hospital, Easton, MD on Monday, August 13, 2001. She was 69.

Born in Dunellen, N.J., April 20, 1932, she was the daughter of John Henry Stockhoff of Juno Beach, FL and the late Vivian V. Behan Stockhoff. After graduating from North Plainfield High School in North Plainfield, N.J. in 1949, she attended Union Jr. College in Cranford, N.J. before graduating from Seton Hall College in 1964 with a B. S. in Elementary Education. She later earned her Masters Degree in Speech Pathology from Kean College in Union, N.J. After her 1964 graduation, she taught elementary school for five years at the Manalapan-Englishtown Regional School in Manalapan. She then was employed as a speech therapist at the same school until retiring in the early 1990's.

She lived in Howell, NJ and Middletown, NJ prior to becoming a resident of Oxford since November of 1994, where she had been very active in community affairs. She served as President of the Oxford Library and Chairman of the Oxford Book Sale Committee for two years, worked for six years with the After School Program at the Oxford Community Center and worked for six years with the RISE Program at Whitemarsh Elementary School. She was also a Docent at the Oxford Customs House, a life member of the Oxford Museum as well as donating time at the Oxford Community

Center.

Surviving, in addition to her father, are her husband, Ernest E. Moore whom she married on Oct. 2, 1983 in Howell, N.J.; a son, Scott A. Hyer of Lisbon, MD; three step-sons, Jeffrey A. Moore of Colts Neck, N.J., Bradley E. Moore of Blairstown, N.J. and Andrew T. Moore of Whitehall, OH; a sister, Linda S. Yeomans of Charlotte, N.C.; a brother, Raymond Stockhoff of Galveston, TX; seven grandchildren and her step-mother, Patricia A. Stockhoff of Juno Beach, FL.
