John Malcolm Bahrenburg, 90, of Oxford, MD, died on Tuesday, November 21, 2017, at The University of Maryland Medical Center in Easton, MD. He was born in New Jersey on March 7, 1927, son of the late Clarence Bahrenburg and Grace Cottrell Bahrenburg.
