John A. Breger, age 80, passed away in Annapolis, MD, on August 4, 2025.

John was born in Wilmington, DE, on March 23, 1945, to Catherine and Daniel Breger. He had a wonderful childhood growing up on the family farm, alongside his sister, Kitty, and brothers, Dan, Jim, and Paul. His boyhood was special in that he had the freedom of living on a farm and the opportunity to work from a young age with his siblings in his father's flower business.

John was a young person with tremendous school spirit, attending St. Mary Magdalen, Salesianum ("Sallies"), and Villanova University, where he earned both his Bachelor's and Master's Degrees in Electrical Engineering.

John worked for several companies over nearly 50 years as an Electrical Engineer. During his long career, he played a key role in the development and leadership of many telecommunications innovations. He also had the opportunity to travel widely in the U.S., Europe, and Asia, both for work and pleasure. He retired from the MITRE Corporation in McLean, VA, in 2014.

John and Joanne married in 1982, and together they enjoyed a wonderful life in Vienna, VA, for nearly 35 years, raising their sons, Jonathan and Michael. The entire family enjoyed many years of active community involvement.

John was a man who lived life to the fullest, with a wide array of accomplishments and interests. In his younger years, he was an active sailor, diver, skier, and photographer, photography being a lifelong passion of his. He also worked tirelessly for Scouting America, often hiking and camping with Troop 673 as his sons advanced through the ranks to both achieve the rank of Eagle Scout. John loved swimming, woodworking, the Chesapeake Bay, and spending time at the Delaware beaches.

In 2015, John and Joanne moved to a beautiful waterfront home on Kent Island on Maryland's Eastern Shore, where John enjoyed nearly 10 years watching ships on the bay and following the changing seasons, always appreciating the area's beautiful flora and fauna.

John is survived by his wife, Joanne, and his sons, Jonathan and his wife, Lauren, and Mike and his fiancée, Bella. He was loved and respected by all who knew him, including his siblings, nieces, nephews, relatives, co-workers, and friends.

A Memorial Funeral Mass will be held at 11 a.m. on Tuesday, August 12, at St. Christopher's Church, located at 1861 Harbor Drive, Chester, MD. Immediately following the service, the family invites you to join them for lunch at Fisherman's Inn, 3116 Main St., Grasonville, MD.

“ I first met John while working at MITRE. His dry wit, warm smile, laughter, and sparkling eyes would light up even the most difficult and dark group projects. Whenever I faced higher-level math beyond my comfort zone, I knew I could count on John to check my work or patiently guide me through what I needed to understand. He was my go-to mathematician.

I had worked alongside him for a couple of years before learning that he had once been a high-level engineering manager, leading a large team of engineers. John never boasted about his achievements— humility being woven into his character.

In personal conversations, he spoke with enthusiasm about Villanova’s men’s basketball team and the water. But the topic that lit him up most was always his family.

One day, when I called just to say hello, Joanne answered to say they were headed out for a medical appointment, but that John would call me back later.

Some hours later, he did. His voice was somber, the familiar droll wit absent. He told me how much he valued our friendship and how much he appreciated getting to know my wife and hearing about my sons. I replied—awkwardly, but sincerely—that I felt the same, and that I had enjoyed getting to know Joanne and hearing so much about Jonathon and Michael. It was warm, but unusual, and at the time I didn’t know quite what to make of it.

A day or two later, Joanne called to tell me that John had been diagnosed with preliminary dementia. I was stunned. Suddenly, that earlier conversation fell into place. Wanting to speak while he was still fully himself—years before his death—John had given me his goodbye.

When he spoke to me, at the moment in time, I didn’t see it for what it was. But then looking back with the full knowledge of what he faced, I saw that moment as one of the most moving of my life. With raw honesty, courageously facing his impending inevitability, John

spoke with deep compassion for how his plight would, in time, affect those who cared about him.
