John William Coche' of Easton and formerly of Annapolis died on Wednesday, January 24, 2018, at the Talbot Hospice House in Easton.

Mr. Coche' was born in Valle Crucis, NC, on June 17, 1938, son of the late John W. Coche', Sr. and Irene Danner Joyce.

John had an early career in insurance in the Washington, DC, area and later Annapolis. In 1985, he changed course and became an expert in the field of hydronics and radiant heat.
