John Kenneth Hyatt, Jr., passed away peacefully surrounded by his family on Thursday, June 19, 2014, at the age of 83.

Born in Lincoln, MA, on September 10, 1930, John grew up in Bronxville, NY, and attended the St. George's School before graduating from the Riverdale Country School in Bronx, NY. He entered the U.S. Naval Academy on July 7, 1949. He was a graduate of the Class of 1953 and was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant in the Marine Corps. After being stationed in Quantico, VA, Kaneohe Bay, HI, San Diego, CA, Vietnam and Iwakuni, Japan, he retired as a Colonel with the U.S. Marine Corps in December 1978.

Upon his retirement, John moved to Easton, MD, where he organized and was managing partner of Heritage Farms. He was a co-founder of the Easton Agricultural Marketing Club. He served as treasurer and board member of the Talbot County Chapter, American Red Cross; President, Memorial Hospital Association; Chairman of the Board of the Memorial Hospital at Easton, as well as serving on the board of the Talbot County United Fund. He was a member and past commodore of the Chesapeake Bay Yacht Club, a former member of the New York Yacht Club, and a life member of the Naval Academy Alumni Association. Since 2012, he has also maintained his residence in Sanibel, FL.

John is survived by his wife, Jennie F. Hyatt of Easton; his daughter, Ann Miller of Nixa, MO; his son, Kenneth C. (KC) Hyatt of Easton; as well as three stepsons, Douglas Campbell of Cordova, Thomas Campbell of Oxford, and P.J. Campbell of Easton. He is also survived by his grandchildren, Eli, Sommer, Ben, Dustin, Alan, Leigh, Tamaron, Taylor, and Garrett, and his two loving cats, Muffin and Sweepea.

He was predeceased by his parents, John Kenneth Hyatt, USNA Class of 1924 and Elizabeth Dowdall Hyatt. An informal Celebration of John's Life will be held at the Academy of the Arts on Saturday, June 28, 2014, at 4 p.m.
