John H. Moose died on Tuesday, March 25, 2014, at Easton Memorial Hospital. He was 89.

Born on December 4, 1924 in Washington, DC, to the late Ernest R. Moose and Harriet (Hoffman) Moose. He grew up in Washington, DC, and graduated from Eastern High School and immediately enlisted in the Army Air Force and became a P47 fighter pilot. Upon honorable discharge, he attended the UMD and graduated with a degree in transportation. John then began a 35 year career with NSA until he retired from government service in June of 1985.
