John Peter Morba, 87, of Easton, MD, died on Thursday, February 9, 2012, after a long illness. John passed away peacefully, surrounded by family and close friends, in Easton. He was born on December 6, 1924, one of four children of the late John K. Morba and Agnes Leaswitch Morba.

He was the beloved husband of Ann M. D'Angelo Morba, his wife of 57 years. He was born and raised in Mahanoy City, PA, where he graduated from high school, followed by studies through Penn State. He joined the U.S. Navy in 1945, serving for four years on the aircraft carrier U.S.S. Philippine Sea, during which time he was part of Admiral Byrd's crew to the South Pole. After the Navy, John began a long and successful career with the U.S. Civil Service, which took him and his family around the globe, from Madrid, Spain, to Arizona, to the Azores and the Panama Canal Zone.

He was a lifelong outdoorsman, from his early days fishing in Locust Valley and working as a game warden, to exploring the ghost towns of the old west, to camping in the deepest wilds of Canada and fishing the deepest seas of the North Atlantic and the balmy southern Pacific. He will forever be remembered for his kindness, generosity of spirit, sense of humor, and life-long devotion to his family and church.

He is survived by his wife and soul mate, Ann; his beloved children, Michele

Tumpane, Alison Stone, Cristy Morrell, and Damon Knight Morba; his devoted sons-in-law, and his nine adoring grandchildren, Courtney, Patrick and Jason Tumpane, Charlotte and Harry Stone, Michael and Madeline Morrell, Genevieve and Jillian Knight; as well as the countless friends and family who were blessed to know him.

Friends and family are invited to celebrate a Memorial Mass on Saturday, February 25, 2012, at 10:30 a.m. at St. Michaels Mission Church, St. Michaels, Maryland, 21663 where John served for years as a dedicated parishioner and usher.
