John Randolph Parker of Chestertown, MD, died on December 11, 2010, in Arlington, Virginia. He was 77.

He was born in Baltimore, MD, on May 28, 1933, the son of the late, Lee and Thelma Marie Gast Parker. Mr. Parker was a 1955 Graduate of Washington College earning a Bachelor of Arts Degree. At Washington College, he was the Captain of the Lacrosse Team and a two-time honorable mention All-American and played in the North-South Game.

He worked as a reporter for the Army Times Publishing Company for 7 years; covered Pentagon & Congress as a Marketing Associate; worked with The National Sugar Refining Company as Merchandising Associate; Presentations Manager with Reader's Digest; Promotion Manager with The New York Daily News; and Advertising Director at 50 Plus Magazine.

Mr. Parker served as a Mason in Glen Burnie Lodge, and served as an Elder in the Presbyterian Church of Chestertown. He enjoyed golfing and writing and self-published five books.

He was preceded in death by his second wife, Margery McClure Parker, and was remarried to his college sweetheart, Mary Lee McIntyre on January 16, 2010.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by two sons, John Randolph Parker, Jr. (Suzanna) of Greensboro, NC, and Max Everett Parker (Denise) of Cos Cob, CT; and grandchildren, Cameron, Tess, Reilly, and Emily.
