John A. Malinowski died on March 5, 2011. He was 84 years old.

Born in Wilmington, Delaware on July 9, 1926, he was the son of the late, John Andrew and Blanche Prusinowska Malinowski. From 1944 until 1946, he served in the Navy, during which time he was stationed in the Pacific. Mr. Malinowski earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Mechanical Engineering from the University of Delaware in 1950, and then began work as a mechanical engineer.
