John William Garner of Little Silver, NJ, died suddenly on Thursday, October 18, 2007, while in Phoenix, AZ. He was 62.

Born on July 24, 1945, in Washington, D.C. he was the son of the late Charles W. and Edna Hall Garner of Tall Timbers, MD. He attended Ryken High School in Leonardtown, MD, and the University of Maryland where he received a Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering. He was employed by the Department of the Navy from 1964 to 1984 and at Booz Allen Hamilton from 1984 to present.

Jack resided in Annapolis, MD from 1975 to 2000, and in Little Silver, NJ, from 2000 to present.
