



## Jon Robbin Wyne

Jon Robbin Wyne passed away at his home in Easton, MD on January 10, 2025, with family at his side.

Jon was born May 7, 1944, in Whittier, CA to Jay R. and Dorothy (Stanton) Wyne. He was a fifth-generation Californian who grew up in Monrovia, CA. He attended Monrovia schools graduating from Monrovia High School where he played on the baseball team and served on various committees and service organizations. He attended college at the University of California, Santa Barbara where he earned his bachelor's degree in economics. He then attended UCLA and received his MBA. While at Santa Barbara, he married his high school sweetheart, Gay (Kelly) Wyne and they began their more than sixty-year adventure.
