



## J. Thomas Lee

April 6, 1924 - January 22, 2009

J. Thomas "Tommy" Lee of Easton, MD died on Thursday, January 22, 2009 at Genesis Healthcare-The Pines. He was 84.

Born April 6, 1924 in New York City, he was the son of the late Patrick J. and Jane Grace Lee. After graduating in 1942 from the High School of Commerce in New York, he served in the U.S. Air Force during World War II. Following his release from active duty in September 1945 he attended the Germaine School of Photography in New York where he received his degree of Commercial Photography in 1950 and the New York Institute of Photography where he also received a degree. In 1953 he moved to Easton where he was employed by Waverly Press until his retirement in July 1978. He operated his own photography studio in Easton until 1992.

He was a member of Sts. Peter & Paul Catholic Church, Easton, E.E. Streets Memorial Post #5118 V.F.W., DAV Chapter 13, the Ninth Air Force Association, and B.P.O. Easton Elks Lodge #1522.

Mr. Lee is survived by his wife, the former Adrianna Petsch, whom he married December 10, 1949; a daughter, Jane Lee Swan and her husband Michael of Easton; a son, James T. Lee, Jr. and his wife Holley of Cordova; a sister, Agnes M. Newberg of NY; three grandchildren and three great-grandchildren. He was predeceased by a brother, Patrick Joseph Lee.

A Funeral Liturgy for Mr. Lee will be celebrated on Wednesday, January 28, 2009 at 1:30 PM at Old St. Joseph's Mission Church, Cordova, MD. Friends may call on Tuesday evening from 6 to 8 PM at Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral Home, P.A., Easton, MD, where a prayer service will be held at 7:30 PM.

Burial will be at St. Joseph's Cemetery, Cordova, MD.
