Julius Albert Spence of Cordova, MD died on Saturday, February 1, 2003 at Deers Head Center, Salisbury, MD. He was 80.

Born June 5, 1922 near Centreville, MD, he was the son of the late William James and Emma Naber Spence. A lifelong resident of Talbot County, he attended Cordova High School after which he served as a carpenter's helper. He was then employed with the Pennsylvania Railroad as a trackman until joining the U.S. Army Infantry during World War II. He served in the Pacific Theatre of Operations and was honorably discharged in 1946, receiving a Good Conduct Medal. Later that same year he married the former Ava Lee Courtney. They made their home in Talbot County where he worked as a carpenter with Seymour Builders as well as Tidewater Builders until retiring in 1988. He continued to work part-time until 1993.

A member of Immanuel Lutheran Church, Easton, MD, he was also a former member of E.E. Streets Memorial Post #5118 V.F.W., Easton.

In addition to his wife, Mr. Spence is survived by a daughter, Judith Ann Spence of Cambridge, MD; a brother, Richard H. Spence of Easton, MD; three sisters, Ellen V. Sauca of Hudson, NY, Edith Roe of Preston, MD and Kathleen Wendt of Easton, MD; one grandchild and numerous nieces and nephews.

Funeral services will be held on Thursday, February 6, 2003 at 11:00 AM at Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral Home, P.A., Easton, MD, where friends may call from 10:30 to 11:00 AM.

Private burial will be at Woodlawn Memorial Park, Easton, MD.
