June Thompson Tewes died April 30, 2015, at the age of 92 years. She was born in Atlanta, GA, but lived many years in Baltimore and Severna Park, MD. For the last 47 years she has lived on the Wye River in Queenstown on the Eastern Shore of Maryland.

She was a member of Old Wye Parish, attending St. Luke's Chapel in Queenstown and served on the Vestry. She was an active member of the Episcopal Church Women, holding various offices and chairmanships. She was an active member in the General Perry Benson Chapter of the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution. She served as chaplain and chairman of Veteran Services.

Her youth was in show business playing the marimba. She played professionally at the Hippodrome Theater in Baltimore, on WBAL's radio show "Calling All Stars" with Gary Moore and various organizations in the Baltimore region. She was an avid Mah Jongg player for many years.

June was married to the late W. Arthur "Bud" Tewes, Jr., for fifty years. She has one son, Dr. Warren Tewes and two grandchildren, Patrick and Kathryn Tewes.
