



## Karen Nancy Wilson

January 28, 1943 - October 6, 2018

Oxford resident K. Nancy Wilson died quietly late Friday night at home with her husband and her beloved neighbors following a long struggle with pancreatic cancer and immunotherapy treatment.

She was born January 28, 1943, in Washington, DC, and, after residing in Raleigh, NC, and Lewisburg, PA, ultimately moved to her beloved Oxford home in 1976. Nancy directed the University of Maryland Eastern Shore Masters of Social Work program and was both a founder and board member of several social service agencies in Talbot County.

She is survived by her husband of 42 years, Peter Dunbar, and two children, Katherine Wilson Dunbar and Michael Wilson Dunbar.
