



Karl Fredric Eger

January 22, 1916 - July 30, 2012

Karl Fredric Eger died at Gilchrist Hospice on July 30, 2012, of prostate bone cancer. He was 96.

Mr. Eger was born in Quincy, MA, and spent his youth with his family in the New England region. In 1939, he moved to Baltimore where he accepted a position in the Engineering Department of Westinghouse Electric Corporation. He worked in the early broadcasting field and later in radar, including the AWACS surveillance system project. He also helped design the camera that was used on the first lunar landing mission.

He was admired for his humility and sense of humor. He spent much time converting a carriage house into a residence in the Ruxton area. He was a member of Grace United Methodist Church on North Charles Street for fifty years.

He is survived by his wife of 70 years, Frances Anne Starkey; two daughters, Carla Brumfield (Woody) of Darlington, Christina Roseberry of Centreville; a sister, Pat Arthur of Monrovia, CA. Another sister, Harriett Meyer died in 1983. He has three grandchildren, Tyson Brumfield, Mollie Smiley, and Andrew Brumfield, six great-grandchildren and many nieces and nephews.

Graveside services will be held on Wednesday, August 1, 2012 at 11:30 AM at

the Stevens family burial grounds in the Church Hill Cemetery in Church Hill, Maryland. A gathering celebrating his life will be held at a later date at Blakehurst.
