January 12, 1957 - December 15, 2011

Keith Alan Nielsen, 54, of Easton, MD, died on Thursday, December 15, 2011, at Memorial Hospital in Easton. Born in East Meadow, Long Island, NY, on January 12, 1957, he was the son of the late Niels Nielsen and Rochelle Amhi Nielsen.

Mr. Nielsen spent his childhood in Old Westbury, New York. He graduated from Wheatley High School in 1975. His first career path started with employment with Radio Relay, where he became involved in the telecommunication industry, tinkering with pagers, mobile phones, telephones, and electronics. Keith relocated to Maryland in 1986, first residing in Gaithersburg and eventually moving to the Eastern Shore in 1990. Starting in 2003, he branched out into several new career fields, including the establishment of a still thriving EBay business – TheBidKahuna, working with his in-laws at Davon Crest Farms as part of their greenhouse management team, and working part-time installing data mining equipment for Earthtec Solutions in Vineland, NJ.

Keith will be sorely missed in the Easton community. While his children were in school, he was S. O. S. fundraising chairman and assisted his wife in her capacity as Band Booster President. He championed an elected school board for the Talbot County Board of Education and advocated to keep the Easton USPS distribution center open.

He is survived by his wife, Cherish Lankford Nielsen; a daughter, Christie Nielsen, 23; a son, Brandon Nielsen, 20; and a stepson, Zachery Klingsmith, 20.

A celebration of Keith's life will be held on December 29, 2011, at 3 p.m. at Temple B'Nai Israel, 101 W. Earl Avenue, Easton, MD 21601.
