



Kenneth Heisey Gibson

March 12, 1945 - December 19, 2024

With profound sadness and heavy hearts, we announce the passing of Kenneth H. Gibson, who was called home to be with the Lord on December 19, 2024. After emergency surgery for esophageal bleeding, Kenny developed pneumonia, and his organs began to shut down. He died peacefully surrounded by loved ones.

Kenny spent his life deeply devoted to his family, his faith, and his community. A man of great integrity, kindness, and humility, Kenny leaves behind a 79-year legacy of love that will continue to inspire all who knew him.

He was a loving husband to his wife, Wendy of 54 years, a devoted father to sons Kent & Ben and father-in-law to Ben's wife Santy, and a proud grandfather to Kade and Shane. His family was the center of his world, and his unwavering support, wise counsel, and sense of humor will be dearly missed by each one of them.

Kenny spent 54 dedicated years to exemplary innkeeping at Sandaway Suites & Beach, and at the Robert Morris Inn earlier in his career. He was an avid sports fan and loved to play golf. His faith was the foundation of his life, and he shared it generously with others, offering a helping hand and a kind word to anyone in need. His life was a testament to the power of love, Christian faith, and service.

He is survived by his beloved wife Wendy, sons Kent and Ben, Ben's wife

Santy, Kent's fiancée Jade, grandsons Kade & Shane, brother Jay and wife Brenda, sister Nancy and a host of beloved extended family and friends who were blessed to know him.
