Kenny Council passed away on Sunday, December 14, 2008 at Easton Memorial Hospital. He was 67 years old.

Kenny was born on July 19, 1941 to Eva Chance Thompson and the late Norman K. Council, Sr in Ridgely, MD. He grew up in Stevensville, MD where he graduated from Stevensville High School where he was a member of the state champion basketball team. He served in the Army National Guard from 1963 to 1969 and worked as a waterman, crabbing and oystering and also as a hunting guide. Kenny started a wholesale seafood business in Bel Air and Suitland, MD. He later worked as a hunting guide with Twin Ponds. From the 1990s to the present he worked at Friels Cannery in Wye Mills, MD.

Kenny was an avid reader who loved hunting, fishing, and breeding dogs. He was also a past president of the Oyster Diving Association.

He is survived by his loving wife, Fran Council of Goldsboro, Md; mother, Eva Thompson of Goldsboro, MD; daughter, Gretchen Haines of Hampstead, 2 grandchildren, Julianna and Theo; stepson, Michael L.
