



Kirk William Johnson

November 8, 1983 - January 5, 2015

CENTREVILLE - Kirk William Johnson, 31, of Centreville, died Jan. 5, 2015 while visiting family in Abbottstown, PA over the holidays.

Mr. Johnson was born Nov. 8, 1983 in Silver Spring, MD. He was the son of Eric B. Johnson, Sr. and Janet W. Johnson, previous residents of Centreville.

He graduated from Queen Anne's County High School in 2001 where he played football for the Lions. While he could be quiet and shy at times, he established a reputation of having a brilliant sense of humor, a quick wit, a genuine sense of friendship and concern for others, and a willingness to serve others before ever beginning to think of his own needs. All who know and remember him will hold in their hearts a memory of Kirk that represents the very best of humanity, tremendous courage, and Herculean strength in the face of adversity.

Mr. Johnson demonstrated leadership from a very early age, becoming a manager of multiple stores before entering the military. He enlisted in the Air Force in June 2004, specializing in Satellite Communications. Mr. Johnson garnered the rank of Senior Airman Below-the-Zone, and ultimately attained the rank of Staff Sergeant in record time. His assignments included Aviano Air Base, Italy and Hill Air Force Base, Utah. While stationed in Italy, he risked his own life and provided critical first aid and trauma care to save the life of an

Airman trapped under an overturned humvee vehicle. He deployed in 2007 to Kandahar Air Base, Afghanistan in support of Operation ENDURING FREEDOM where he served his country with honor and valor, earning the Afghanistan Campaign Medal.

Mr. Johnson is survived by his 8 year old daughter, Adriana N. Johnson, the love of his life and his heart. He is also survived by his parents Eric and Janet and his six siblings: Joy C. Denes, Eric B. Johnson, Jr., Gregory D. Johnson, Mark J. Johnson, Meggan A. Gage, and Jacob A. Johnson.

For Pennsylvania area residents, a Memorial will be held on Sunday, Jan. 11, at 3:30 pm at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Gettysburg Ward Chapel located at 1170 Kohler Mill Road, New Oxford, PA.

Funeral service will be held at 11:30AM on Thursday January 15, 2015 at The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints 1875 Richie Highway Annapolis, MD where family and friends may visit from 10AM to 11:30AM. Interment will follow in the Maryland Veterans Cemetery in Crownsville, MD at 1:45PM with military honors.

“ We will never forget the afternoon Kirk and Adriana showed up on our doorstep here in Orem, Utah. None of us had met Kirk before, but all of us loved him the minute we saw him. He had recently been assigned to Hill Air Force Base which is about an hour and a half north of us, and he found us from our address on a Christmas letter I had sent to friends and family that had reached him in Afghanistan.

He came on a particularly busy day. Diantha was graduating the next day from a small, specialized high school and we were all going to go as a family to her senior dinner and talent show where Diantha was to sing a solo. Even though we needed to get ready for the event, none of us moved or left the room, but sat spell-bound by Kirk and his wonderful, charismatic personality. He was so much fun and had such interesting stories. We all connected with him, were spell-bound and didn't want the spell to be broken. We didn't dare tell him we needed to go somewhere because we didn't want him to leave. We finally had to throw ourselves together to get to the event a little late. From that day until Kirk left Utah, we loved having him over—sometimes he came to church with us, sometimes he came over for dinner, and once he went with us to the Manti Pageant which is about a two hour drive from here. He had such a commanding presence! He was so open and honest and loving — and so unselfish. One day he called and said we had been making dinner for him and it was his turn to make dinner for us. He came down and made a delicious dinner. We remember the chicken with bacon on top served with a pasta salad he made from scratch. He bought every person an orange cream soda and just really went all out to show his love and appreciation for us having him over.

He was such a wonderful, loving father to his beautiful little Adriana. He took such good care of her. She was well dressed and her hair was always fixed. He was so tender and kind to her, and it was sweet to watch them together. I can't imagine the sorrow and loneliness he has felt without her around. He lived for his daughter and loved her with all his heart.

We are so proud of the military service Kirk unselfishly gave to his country.

We are stunned that Kirk is gone and we will miss him so much. We are among those who truly mourn his passing and we have been praying for his family.
