L. Wayne Bryden of Worton, Maryland, passed away peacefully after a long battle with illness at the age of 86.

He was born and raised in Rock Hall, Maryland. His mother's family owned a large farm in Rock Hall, and he spent his youth attending school and working on the farm. He and his wife, Edith Bryden met and married in the mid-1950's and they raised a family of two sons in Chestertown, Maryland.
