November 3, 1936 - October 14, 2014

Larry D. Leonard died on Tuesday, October 14, 2014, at Queen Anne Hospice Center in Centreville, MD. He was 77.

Born on November 3, 1936, in Tilghman, MD, he was the son of the late William T. Leonard and Rosetta Bernice Sweitzer Leonard. Larry attended St. Michaels High School, graduating in 1954. That year he enlisted in the U.S. Air Force, serving in England. In 1962, he was honorably discharged.

On August 18, 1962, he married the former M. Teresa Sherwood.

In 1959, he began working with Airpax Corporation. In 2002, he retired from Airpax Corp. as the Executive Vice-President of International Operations. He set-up factories and staffed them in England, Japan, Scotland, Belgium, China, Mexico, Singapore, and Indonesia. Mr. Leonard owned and operated Leonard's Inc., a sporting goods business he operated out of his home.

Larry was a member of the Elks Lodge, American Legion, Caroline County Country Club, and A.O.P.A. He enjoyed flying, golfing, gardening, and fishing.

In addition to his wife, Teresa, he is survived by two sons, L. David Leonard, II, and Thomas M. Leonard; two brothers, William F. Leonard and wife Jean, and Albert E. Leonard and wife, Christine; four grandchildren, Devendramae

Marta Nicole Leonard, Kendall Marie Leonard, Haleigh Michelle, and Thomas Michael, Jr.

A funeral service will be held on Wednesday, October 22, 2014, at 11:00 a.m. at the Maryland Eastern Shore Veteran's Cemetery Chapel in Hurlock.
