Laura Elizabeth Murphy of Easton, MD, died on Saturday, March 29, 2008, at William Hill Manor, Easton. She was 86.

Born July 29, 1921, in St. Paul, MN, she was the daughter of the late Andrew and Bertha Lydgren Erickson. After graduating from high school in St. Paul, she served in the U.S. Navy from 1943 to 1946. While serving in the Navy, she met George P. Murphy whom she married on December 29, 1945. After release from active duty, the Murphy's made their home in Easton, MD, where Mr. Murphy later served as Mayor. Mayor Murphy died June 8, 1996.

A homemaker for most of her life, Mrs. Murphy was a member of Rebecca Lodge and Odd Fellows. She was a charter member of St. Mark's United Methodist Church, where she was a member of the Deborah Circle, sang in the choir for many years, and loved to serve as usher. She loved to bowl, a sport that she began at the age of 16 and continued until prevented by health reasons at the age of 85.

Mrs. Murphy is survived by three children: James B. Murphy and his wife Melanie Reynolds-Murphy of Daniel Island, SC, David G. Murphy and his wife Kim of Kennesaw, GA, and Michael E. Murphy and his wife Robin of Preston, MD; seven grandchildren, Joshua and Kristian Murphy, Courtney Steele, and Erickson, Luke, Page and Michael Murphy; and one great-grandson, Ethan

Steele. In addition to her parents and husband, she was predeceased by one brother and one sister.

Funeral services will be held on Friday, April 4, 2008, at St. Mark's United Methodist Church in Easton at 10:00 AM. Friends may call at the church on Thursday evening from 5 to 7 PM.

Burial will be at Woodlawn Memorial Park, Easton.
