December 24, 1954 - January 30, 2025

Laura Cook Jones, 70, of Stevensville, MD, joined her Lord and Savior Jesus Christ in heaven on Thursday, January 30, 2025 after a sudden stroke the previous week. She was recently predeceased by her husband of 45 years, Michael Lee Jones, in August 2024. Laura is survived by her loving children, their spouses, and two grandchildren: Megan Jones; Kevin Jones, his wife Dana, and their children Liam and Parker; and Samantha Jones Chafe and her husband Nathaniel.

Laura was born in Baltimore, Maryland on December 24, 1954 to Robert and Elizabeth Cook (both deceased). She was the youngest of five sisters: Jean, Candace, Susan, and Sally. She is survived by her sisters Candace C. Short and Sally Myers as well as by many beloved nieces, nephews, great-nieces, and great-nephews. Laura grew up with her family in Baltimore, attending Open Bible Church and going to Pioneer Girls camp where she made many lifelong friendships. Laura graduated from Northern High School in 1972.

Laura earned an Associate of Arts degree in Medical Records Science from the Community College of Baltimore in 1974. After graduation, she began her career as a medical records technician at Union Memorial Hospital and took night classes at Towson State University where she met her husband Michael. Laura was a Registered Health Information Technician and held many titles within her field at hospitals all across Maryland during her 46-year career. She

retired in 2020.

Michael and Laura were married on New Year's Eve in 1978 and honeymooned in Walt Disney World. Michael and Laura purchased their home on Kent Island in 1982, where they raised their three children and lived until their passing. Laura was a very active member of Wye Bible Church in Grasonville, serving on the praise team, volunteering at summer camp - Camp Good News, and mentoring in their youth program. Laura also enjoyed quality time with her husband and family - attending musical theatre and traveling around the world.

God graciously carried Laura from this life into eternity as dawn broke on January 30th.

A funeral service for Laura will be held on Wednesday, February 5, 2025 at Wye Bible Church, 115 Narnia Drive, Grasonville, MD. Friends and family may visit from 10am-11am with service at 11am. Burial will follow the service at the Stevensville Cemetery, 808 Main Street, Stevensville, MD. Fellowship time following the burial will be at Wye Bible Church.

“*My Aunt Laura and I's relationship got off to an inauspicious start when I arrived on the scene in 1963, a mere 8 years after her, she being the youngest of the 5 Cook Sisters and my Mother, Jean, being the eldest. I was the first Grandchild of her parents and the 'first boy' after a succession of 5 girls so, naturally, my Grandfather 'took a shine' to me, though he passed after only two years after becoming a Grandfather and when Aunt Laura was about 10 years old. She later admitted to me, when we were older, that I was not a 'welcome addition' at the time, in her eyes, as I had turned her Father's affections towards me, a completely understandable sentiment from a child's perspective.*

I believe a turning point in our relationship may have been when my own Father passed when I was 8 years old and she saw a nephew who now had a common experience of losing a parent too soon. Any childhood animosity or jealousy she may have experienced soon melted away and she embraced the role of 'Aunt'. She, too, had been thrust into a tumultuous family situation on the untimely passing of a Father and was forced by fate to assume a maturity beyond her young years.

If you ever asked me who taught me to dance, I would be quick to remember and credit 'Aunt Laura'. She demonstrated to me, in the classic style of the 1970's, how to 'cut a rug' to the strains of The Jackson Five in my Grandmother's living room, her now a teen and myself still a child, just smiling, laughing and having fun during what was not an easy time for either of us. She arranged for me to have my first motorcycle ride with a boyfriend of hers at the time, which I still recall to this day, and probably inspired my lifelong love of motorcycling. She was a 'Cool Aunt' filling more of a 'Big Sister' role in my life as we were closer in age than she and my own Mother were.

She loved my Mother as well, as difficult as that could be, sometimes. She didn't judge her and seemingly served as almost the 'Elder Sister' to her, staying in touch and being a 'listener and

counselor'. When my Mother's third Husband passed in South Carolina, Aunt Laura and I made a road trip together to be there. I relished having her to myself and discussing a wide-ranging set of topics 'one on one'...laughing, sharing, bonding.

In the past few years as our age gap seemed to lessen, we enjoyed each other's company whenever we had the chance in person, or on the occasion of phone calls that would end up going on for extended periods of time, neither of us minding how much time had passed. She was a mentor, counselor, advisor, sounding board, listener, and dearly beloved friend and had a dash of humor and much love to share with all around her. Steady, stoic, measured, and wise. She willingly stepped into a void in my life, along with my other Aunts, her Sisters, and sustained me through difficult times.

I last saw her not long before Uncle Michael passed. She loved him dearly and took care of him to the end, fulfilling her marriage vows before God. I cherish our last embrace, during which I felt her physical frailty, but sensed her inner strength. A strength she would be quick to credit to her Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, whom she lived her life in honor of. I have peace in knowing her eternal destiny and glory, though my heart mourns her so. She loved, and was loved.
