Lee Brittingham Aldrich of Easton, MD, formerly of Wades Point Farm, McDaniel, MD, passed away on Saturday, April 26, 2014, at William Hill Gardens. She was 84.

Lee and her husband, John, lived for many years in Timonium, MD, and also in Orlando, FL, and Shady Side, MD. She was a docent for Londontown Gardens in Edgewater, MD. Lee performed various volunteer duties for Havenwood Presbyterian Church, Timonium, MD. And she was a lifelong member of Christ Episcopal Church, St. Michaels, MD.

She grew up on Wades Point Farm in McDaniel, MD, operated as a guest house by the Kemp family for three generations, and graduated from St. Michaels High School in 1947. After high school, she worked as a secretary in Easton, including for the law offices of James F. Stewart, Esq.

Lee was a homemaker, gardener, an animal and music lover, and avid reader with a special interest in Civil War books. She loved to send and receive letters and notes, and frequently corresponded with relatives and friends. She will be treasured for her sense of humor and generosity. She had many friends she treasured over the years.

She is survived by her two daughters, Nancy Garner of Silver Spring, MD, and

Joan Aldrich; and one grandson.

In addition to her parents she was preceded in death by her husband, John Aldrich.

Burial will be private.
