Leonard "Frog" Dixon of Cecilton died Sunday, Feb. 12, 2006, in his home. He was 82.

Mr. Dixon was born in Earleville, son of the late Leonard and Anna (Holden) Dixon.

He was a self-employed farmer until 1964. In 1964, he went to work for the Georgetown Yacht Basin and worked there for many years.

He loved collecting frogs, hence, his nickname. He enjoyed hunting with his friends. He loved baseball, and for many years played shortstop on the Cecilton town team. In his younger years, he played on the George Biddle High School baseball team, and in 1939, when they won the championship for Cecil County. He also enjoyed bowling and other sports until past injuries forced him to quit playing. In the early years of his sons, he was involved in Scouting.

Mr. Dixon was a Master Mason, a past worshipful master of the Cecil Lodge 125, A.F. & A.M., Chesapeake City. He also was a member of the Eastern Star, Order 84, in Elkton, and a member of the Zion United Methodist Church in Cecilton.
