



## Lewis Crandall Woodworth

Lewis Crandall Woodworth died on Thursday, September 6, 2007. He was 81 years old.

Lewis Woodworth was born on June 15, 1926, to the late Lewis Angle Woodworth and Dorothea Clinton in Portland, OR. At the age of 15, Lewis joined the army where he served for 22 years. The highlight of his career was attending the Monterey Language School to learn Russian. He worked as an interpreter for the Allies in Vienna while with military intelligence. Another highlight while he served in the U.S. Army was the pistol team at Fort Brage, NC. He trained extensively in shooting, competed nationally and won numerous medals. He also enjoyed collecting stamps and coins.

Upon retiring in 1963, he went to U.C. Berkeley where he earned his Master's degree in linguistics and Russian. He taught Russian and German at Dickinson College, worked with NSA where he learned Burmese and Vietnamese, and retired in 1990. He was fluent in German, Russian, Latin, Polish, and Burmese. Lewis traveled extensively with his wife, Isingard, and resided in Pennsylvania until she died in 2004. Lewis he moved to the Eastern Shore of Maryland.

Lewis Crandall Woodworth is survived by two daughters, Susanna Tuttle and her husband Professor Kenneth Tuttle of John Day, Oregon, and Ellinor

Woodworth of Morlenbach, Germany; a sister, Beatrice Richmond of Camp Verde, AZ, a brother, the Honorable Douglas R. Woodworth of San Diego, CA; and three grandchildren, Lewis N. Tuttle, Meghan I. Jobin, and Stephanie E. Diestelkamp.

Interment with full military honors will take place at Arlington National Cemetery on Tuesday, November 6, 2007 at 1 pm.
