Linford Harry Swain of Stevensville, MD died at Corsica Hills Nursing Home on December 29, 2007. He was 88 years old.

Born on July 15, 1919 in Roanoke, VA, he was the son of the late, Harry Bufford Swain and Ottie Dove Harris Swain. Mr. Swain would begin his career with The Virginia Bridge Works in Roanoke, VA. He served as a radio operator, from 1943-1945 in the ETO of World War II in the First Army, V Corps, 2nd Infantry Division, fighting in campaigns in Normandy, Northern France, Ardennes, Rhineland, and Central Europe. He received the EAME Theatre Ribbon, Distinguished Unit Badge, and the Bronze medal. He was honorably discharged in October 1945, and soon moved to Washington, D.C. where he was employed by the Washington Gas and Light Company while he attended electronics school under the GI Bill. In 1951 he began his career with IBM. He and his wife, Jean moved to Stevensville, MD in 1976 where Mr. Swain eventually retired in 1981.

He was a member of the American Legion Post 278 in Stevensville, MD and a member of the Home Improvement Association of Kent Island Estates.

Mr. Swain is survived by his wife of 45 years, Jean L. Swain of Stevensville, MD; a step-son, James Edward Floyd of Salisbury, MD and a grandson, Jack Floyd of Germantown, MD; two nieces, Jeannine Hannabass Gregory of

Laytonsville, MD and Lorene Hannabass Sherman of Barnegat, NJ.
