July 10, 1945 - September 27, 2008

Lloyd “Butch” Samuel Blankenbiller of Sudlersville, MD died Saturday, September 27, 2008 at the Chester River Hospital Center in Chestertown, MD. He was 63.

“Butch” Blankenbiller was born July 10, 1945 in Berks County, PA the son of the late Samuel H. Blankenbiller and Marian “Eamer”. Mr. Blankenbiller attended Oley Valley High School in Pennsylvania. Mr. Blankenbiller moved to Maryland around 1973. Butch worked as a heavy equipment operator for most of his life, his last employer was Brawner Builders. Butch enjoyed playing poker, fishing, and working on cars. He loved to work on and drive his 1967 GMC truck, which he affectionately referred to as “Old Blue”.
