



Louise Virginia Greaves

October 11, 1919 - November 11, 2014

Louise Virginia Bullen Greaves, of Queenstown, MD, died on November 11, 2014, at Heartland House in Grasonville, MD. She was 95 years old.

Louise was born in Stevensville on October 11, 1919, daughter of the late Samuel Bullen and Sidney Grimes Bullen. She met and married Albert W. Greaves, who died in 2009. They had been married for 72 years at the time of his death. She was predeceased by three sisters and a brother (Clara Frances Galicki, Thelma B. Thomas, Emma Katherine O'Donnell, and Samuel R. Bullen).

Louise was a devoted wife and beloved aunt who is survived by Denise G. and Jeff Hunsucker, who cared for her, allowing her to remain independently in her home until recently. She had additional nieces and nephews who loved her dearly: Patrick Bullen, Nancy Althoff, Jim O'Donnell, Beth Meredith, William Greaves Jr., Danny Greaves, Pam Reed, Donald Greaves, Marsha Greaves, and Brenda Lemon. Joining these nieces and nephews in mourning are spouses and many grand-nieces and nephews. Richard Galicki, Tom Lemon, Larry Bullen, Bobby O'Donnell, and Butch O'Donnell were additional nephews who preceded her in death.

Louise enjoyed her life as a farmer's wife, and worked for many years at the sewing factory in Grasonville, along with her sisters and many local ladies.

After leaving the sewing factory, she became a well-known local seamstress. She loved living on or near the Wye River, and loved to eat crabs, oysters, clams, and rockfish. Louise enjoyed cooking -- she was renowned for her hot milk cake with chocolate icing.

Louise was a member of the Old Wye Episcopal Church in Wye Mills, and devoted her time and service to the alter guild and the ladies auxiliary. She also attended Immanuel Methodist Church in Grasonville during the last few years.

A visitation will be held on Sunday, November 16, 2014, from 2-5 pm at Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral Home, P.A. in Centreville, MD. Services will be held on Monday, November 17, 2014, at 11 am Old Wye Parish Church in Wye Mills, MD. Interment will follow at Old Wye Church Cemetery.
