May 7, 1920 - January 15, 2010

Lucy Haddaway of Wittman died on Friday, January 15, 2010, at the Talbot Hospice House in Easton. She was 89.

Born on May 7, 1920, in Baltimore City, she was the daughter of the late, Clarence and Ivy Newnam Mister. Due to the Great Depression and lack of work, Lucy and her family frequently re-located to Baltimore, MD, to Neavitt, MD, and then to Tilghman, MD. For the last thirty years, Lucy headed up the draper room in Higgins and Spencer. Prior to that, she worked in the St. Michaels Sewing Factory and at Harrison and Jarboes Tomato Cannery.

During her children's teenage years, Lucy and her husband, Ormond, whom she married in March 1945, chaperoned the St. Michaels YMCA Dances. She was a great storyteller; due to the fact that once she met you, she never forgot your name.

She enjoyed raising African Violets, making hot milk cakes, pound cakes, and scratch biscuits during holidays and special occasions. Up until October 2009, she did hand sewing for friends and neighbors. Lucy was an active member of the Asbury United Methodist Church in Wittman.

Mrs. Haddaway is survived by her son, George Lindsay, and his wife, Brenda; one son-in-law, Perry Dyott, Jr; three grandchildren, Monica Dyott Heinsohn

and her husband, Jeff, Deven Lindsay Callahan and her husband, Paul, and Darrin Lindsay and his wife, Dawn; and seven great-grandchildren. In addition to her parents, Lucy was preceded in death by her husband, Ormond Haddaway; a son, Glen Lindsay; and a daughter, Helen Lindsay Dyott.

A funeral service will be held on Thursday, January 21, 2010, at the Asbury United Methodist Church, 22606 Pot Pie Road, Wittman, MD at noon. Friends may call at the church one hour prior to the service.

Burial will be held at the Wesleyan Church Cemetery, Tilghman, MD.
