



Lyman Dean Hall

October 12, 1929 - July 5, 2025

L. Dean Hall of Chestertown, MD formerly of West River, MD died July 5, 2025, at University of Maryland Shock Trauma. He was 95.

Born on October 12, 1929, in Jackson, Michigan to the late Lyman R. and Geraldine M. Schreder Hall. Dean attended El Camino College in California for 2 years while serving in the United States Air Force SAC flying bombers over Russia during the Cold War from 1952 until 1960. On March 16, 1990, he married June Taft.

After the Air Force he worked as a flight engineer with American Airlines and retired after over 35 years. Later he worked as a private pilot instructor, authored the Maryland Historical Trust award winning book "Stewards of West River". In addition, he spent 30 years restoring the historical site "Norman's Retreat" where he resided until moving to Heron Point in 2021.

Dean was a member of Sons of the American Revolution and the Annapolis Lions Club. He enjoyed sailing, skiing, hunting, playing tennis and writing. He was a true craftsman whether it was in restoration, carpentry or art

In addition to his parents Dean was preceded in death by his son, Larry Joe Hall.

He is survived by his wife of 35 years June Taft Hall; a son Jeffery Hall (Elizabeth) of Lovettsville, VA and Granddaughter Victoria Scolaro (Patrick) of Lovettsville, VA.
