May 29, 1924 - February 10, 2015

Mabel Virginia Plutschak Cole passed away at Genesis Health Care–The Pines in Easton, MD, on Tuesday, February 10, 2015, at the age of 90 years.

Born in Preston, MD on May 29, 1924, she was the youngest daughter of Edward and Augusta Kleinschmidt Plutschak. She grew up on the family farm near town, one of 14 children. She graduated from Preston High School in 1941, remembered as a superb athlete.

As a young woman, Mabel was employed at C & P Telephone Company. On July 6, 1947, she married John Paul Cole, a WWII veteran and local businessman. They spent many happy years together as residents of Clifton on Hawkes Hill Road in Easton. Both enjoyed traveling, visits to Ocean City, MD, and a love of dogs as pets. They shared over 56 years of marriage, prior to Mr. Cole's passing on May 14, 2004.

In February 2010, Mrs. Cole became a resident of the Dixon House on Higgins Street in Easton. In February 2014, she entered Genesis Health Care – The Pines, where she resided for a year.

Mabel is survived by one brother, Ernest H. (Bob) Plutschak and wife, Janice of Hurlock; sister-in-law, Rosalie Sard of Easton; and many nieces and nephews, including Joyce Carroll of Easton and Dennis Plutschak of Hurlock

who managed her care over the past five years.

Mrs. Cole was preceded in death by six brothers, Paul, August, William Herman, Carl, and Elmer Plutschak and six sisters; Agnes Dietrich, Louise Wright, Alma Burkett, Hilda White, Clara Tjaden, and Lily Harper.

Funeral services will be held at the MD Veterans Cemetery near Beulah on Wednesday, February 18, 2015, at 11 a.m. with Rev. Nevin Crouse officiating. Pall Bearers will be nephews of Mrs. Cole.
