



Margaret Jane White Moore

January 8, 1919 - February 6, 2012

Jane W. Moore, age 93, died February 6, 2012, at Heartfields in Easton, MD. She was born Margaret Jane White on January 8, 1919, in Haverhill, MA, to Earl W. White and Margaret Sturgis White, both of Snow Hill, MD.

She was a graduate of the Vesper George School of Art, Union Memorial Hospital School of Nursing, and the University of Maryland. Her long nursing career included a position on the faculty of the Easton Memorial Hospital School of Nursing from 1955 to 1966, and directing the Nursing Department of the Talbot County Health Department from 1967 to 1987. She was the first president of the Maryland Council of Public Health Nursing Directors, a chairman of the board of the Critchlow Adkins Children's Center, and served on the board of the Talbot Cancer Society. After her retirement, she volunteered at the St. Michaels Library and the Talbot County Historical Society.

She was preceded in death by her husband of 44 years, Charles W. Moore of Snow Hill, MD. She is survived by two daughters, Susan Moore of Meadows of Dan, VA, and Alexandria Crump of Easton; two grandchildren; and two great-grandchildren.

A memorial service will be held on Friday, February 10, at 3:00 P.M. at Christ Episcopal Church in Easton.
