Margaret Stanley Mickey, environmentalist and homemaker, died peacefully at her home in Easton on May 5, 2005. Born in Baltimore, Maryland, she was the daughter of Faith Perry Stanley and Harvey Stanley.

A long-time resident of the Washington, D.C. area, she worked at the U. S. Supreme Court and was a founding member of Concern, Incorporated, one of the first non-profit organizations formed to promote environmental literacy and consumer education. At Concern she helped to develop policies and public awareness on issues such as recycling, PCB's, and clean water. After moving to Easton, she served on the board of the Nature Conservancy and continued her environmental advocacy.

Mrs. Mickey was a member of the Metropolitan Club and the Chevy Chase Club in the Washington area, and she served for many years as a docent at the National Gallery of Art. She was also a member of the Talbot Country Club and the Harbor Club in Easton. She enjoyed hunting, fishing and boating with her husband, Paul F. Mickey, as well as music, art, and most of all friendship. She is survived by three children: Margo Steiner-King of Boulder, Colorado; Paul F. Mickey, Jr., of Arlington, Virginia; and Frank T. Mickey of Bethesda, Maryland. She has six grandchildren.

Easton, Maryland on Saturday the 14th of May, 2005, at 11:00 AM.
