Along with this she worked as a family counselor and taught marriage and family seminars. She was honored by her many successes with Governor citations and invitations to speak to audiences in Europe.

While her commitment to her work with others was unrelenting so was her commitment to her family, as a devoted wife and mother, and to her friends. Her presence and persona allowed for people close to her and even those newly acquainted to her to open up to her and feel completely comfortable

talking to her and confiding in her. Her spirit lives on while her smile, happy voice, and laughter will continue to uplift and inspire many of our hearts and minds.

Survivors include her husband of 43 years, Gunter; two sons, Kurt and Karl; sister, Anne; brother Dereck and neice, Andrea; nephews, Adrian and Seyan. A memorial service will be held at Emmanuel Church in Chestertown on August 1st at 11AM.
