November 11, 1922 - August 16, 2024

Marguerite L. Davis died at Heron Point of Chestertown, Maryland on August 16, 2024. She was 101 years old, born on November 11, 1922 in Sherbrooke, Quebec, Canada. She was the daughter of Raoul Laurence and Jeanne LeSieur. She was predeceased by her two brothers, Jean Claude and Jacques, and three sisters Claire Kelly, Suzanne Ste. Marie, and Madeleine Fauteux.
