On Saturday January 17, 2004, Marguerite "Marge" Mallet of Ferndale, Maryland, and previous 20-year resident of Stevensville, Maryland, died of cancer at North Arundel Hospital. She was 51.

Born August 19, 1952 in Baltimore, Maryland, she attended St. Jane Frances Parochial School and Northeast High School in Riviera Beach, Maryland. She later graduated the University of Maryland University College with a Bachelor of Arts Degree.

Her career in the Civil Service of the Federal Government included service at the US Naval Academy and more recently with the Veterans Administration in Baltimore until her retirement in 2003.

She was a member of Saint Christopher's Catholic Church in Chester, Maryland. Her interests included gardening, needlework, reading and being with her family. She was also a world traveler visiting many parts of the globe including; Japan, Pakistan and much of Europe.
