Marianne W. Hollis of Easton, MD, died on Tuesday, March 25, 2014, at University of Maryland Shore Medical Center at Easton. She was 76. Mrs. Hollis was born in Washington, DC, on December 6, 1937, to the late Lorraine Youngberg and stepfather, Arthur Youngberg.

Mrs. Hollis met her future, loving husband of 56 years, John M. Hollis, at Eastern High School, where she graduated in the Class of 1955.

Mr. & Mrs. Hollis married on June 29, 1957, in Silver Spring, MD. They resided in Rockville, MD, for 25 years, before moving to Easton. She was an art student at Montgomery College and Chesapeake College. Most recently, Mrs. Hollis was an art teacher for the residents of William Hill Manor and Genesis Healthcare - The Pines, Easton.
