



## Marilyn R. McGriff

September 6, 1934 - July 16, 2025

Marilyn R. McGriff (Schacht) passed away peacefully on Wednesday, July 16th, at the age of 90. She was preceded in eternal life by her beloved husband, Patrick T. McGriff (2016); her parents, Dr. Roland and Helen (Allman) Schacht; and her brother, Roland John Schacht, Jr.

She is survived by her sister, Kathryn “Peg” McCausland; her two children, daughter Stacia Skinner (Steven) and son Patrick McGriff III (Lois); her two grandchildren, Brendan Skinner (Amie) and Colin Skinner; and her great-granddaughter, Fiona Skinner.

A graduate of Northwestern University and a member of the Chi Omega sorority, Marilyn’s life passion was music. She spent most of her career as a music teacher at Atwater Elementary School in Shorewood, WI, where her school concerts were known to be “standing room only” and often moved to the local high school to accommodate the large audiences. Broadway star Kate Baldwin credited Marilyn’s influence, saying, “Marilyn McGriff at Atwater grade school got me started.”

A gifted pianist, Marilyn played nearly every day of her life. She was a visionary in music education and a dedicated supporter of the arts. She was deeply involved with PianoArts in Milwaukee, WI, the North American Competition and Music Festival, and was a founding board member and sole contributor to the Audience Communication Award.

Marilyn traveled the world, possessed exceptional talent, and cherished time with her family and friends. Where words fail, music speaks - and Marilyn

spoke fluently through her music.
