



Marion Henry Chambers

August 7, 1916 - January 26, 2010

Marion Henry Owens Chambers of Centreville, MD died at Chester River Hospital Center, Chestertown, MD on Tuesday, January 26, 2010. He was 93.

Born August 7, 1916 in Centreville, MD, he was the son of the late, Carroll Dunbar and Mary Margretta Covington Chambers. Mr. Chambers graduated from Centreville High School in 1934 and went to work for Valliant Fertilizer in Centreville and part time at the A & P Grocery. He spent about one year working with his uncle doing steel construction until he was drafted into the U.S. Army in 1942. He was medically discharged in 1943. He returned to work on the family farm. In December 1945, he went to work at Seney Oil Company as a delivery man. He retired in 1981, as Company President, after 36 years of hard work.

He was a member of the Centreville United Methodist Church for 50 years; an active member of St. Tammany Lodge Odd Fellows, for 60 years and was a legionnaire for 65 years, having served as a past Post Commander of Jeff Davis American Legion Post 18. He was Trustee for Salem Church for many years.

Mr. Chambers is survived by two daughters, Rebecca Jane Crouch and her husband, Ronnie of Warrenton, VA and Carol Chambers Rowley and her husband, Dave of Uncasville, CT; a sister Jane Potter of Centreville, MD; four

grandchildren, Dave Rowley and his wife, Gloria of Wakefield, RI, Jennifer Haring and her husband, Marcus of McDonough, GA, Caroline Goode and her husband, Lloyd of Roanoke, VA and Emily Crouch of The Woodlands, TX; five great grandchildren, Sierra Rowley, Vince, Kelsey and Kevin Haring and Isaiah Goode. He was preceded in death by his wife of 57 years, Becky, his son, "C.D." and a sister, Kathryn Quimby.

Funeral services will be held at Centreville United Methodist Church on Saturday, January 30, 2010 at 2:00 PM where friends and family may call from 1:00 to 2:00 .

Burial will be Chesterfield Cemetery.
