Marion "Pete" A. Councill of Chestertown, Maryland died at Chestertown Nursing and Rehabilitation Center on November 23, 2005. He was 87.

Born September 21, 1918 in Easton, Maryland, he was the last surviving of ten children born to the late Peter Paul and Florence Cannon Councill. He attended Cordova High School and then began to work on the family farm and later Eley Lumber Company. On November 3, 1942 he married Evelyn Usilton of Lynch, Maryland. In 1943, Mr. Councill entered into the U.S. Army and was honorably discharged in 1946 as a Tech. Sergeant. Upon returning home, he continued his employment with Eley Lumber until 1973 when he took the job as foreman and built the Manor House on Wye Plantation for Arthur A. Houghton, Jr. He then worked as Maintenance Supervisor at Wye Plantation until retiring in 1985. After residing in Queen Anne for the majority of his life, in 1998 he and his wife moved to Chestertown to be close to their family.

He is a member of the Hillsboro-Queen Anne United Methodist Church where he was past president of the Methodist Men's group.

In addition to his wife, Evelyn Usilton Councill, he is survived by one son, R. Allen Councill and his wife, Geraldine "Gerry" of Chestertown; one grandson, Brian Allen Councill and his wife, Angela of Chestertown; and one great grandson, Jacob Allen Councill, of Chestertown. He was preceded in death

by five sisters and four brothers.

Funeral services will be held at the Fellows, Helfenbein and Newnam Funeral Home, P. A., Centreville, Maryland on Saturday, November 26, 2005 at 2 p.m., where family and friends may call one hour prior.

Burial will be in Woodlawn Memorial Park, Easton, Maryland.
