Mark Allen Rustand of Chestertown, MD died on January 8, 2021 in Cambridge, MD. He was 66.

He was born on January 1, 1955 in Duluth, Minnesota the son of the late Ellis Duane and Phyllis Louise Wehmeyer Rustand. His stepmother, Grace Bishop Rustand of Easton MD, recently predeceased Mark. Both died of COVID complications.

Mark worked at Millard Lumber Company in Bellevue, Nebraska following his high school and college graduation. He moved to Pennsylvania in 1987 to be closer to family where he was a carpenter and managed a historic property in Wayne, PA.
