



Ms. Marlene Mary Zinter

January 31, 1932 - May 28, 2013

Marlene Mary Zinter passed away peacefully, surrounded by her loving family, at her home in Easton, MD., on Thursday May 28, 2013. She was 81 years old.

Marnie, as she was known to family and friends, was born January 31, 1932, in Wayzata, MN. She was the daughter of the late Olaf Johnson and Helga Loraas Johnson, and fourth in line of their five children.

Marnie graduated from Wayzata High School in 1950. Working as a secretary for Gehrman's Animal Hospital, she met and married Dr. Delvin Eugene Zinter in 1954. They subsequently moved their family to Maryland to pursue her husband's career at the USDA research Center in Beltsville. Marlene worked as a department manager at Garfinkels from 1972 – 1984, and Changing Point as a bookkeeper from 1986-1991. She became a resident of Easton, MD, in 1992.

She was an active and dedicated member of Immanuel Lutheran Church and cherished her church family. Marlene was a docent for the Talbot Historical Society from 1993-1996, and was an active member of the VFW Post 5118 Woman's Auxiliary. When not keeping busy with her growing family and grandchildren, she was an avid reader, enjoyed needle work like knitting and gardening.

She is survived by her children and their spouses; Wendy and Raymond Kern, Craig and Connie Zinter, Leanne and Stephen Farias, and Colleen and Chris Davies; ten grandchildren; a great grandson, Zachary; and her sister, Grace McKay.

She was predeceased by her husband, Delvin Eugene Zinter in 1988; her great-granddaughter Zoe; and her three brothers.

A memorial service will be held at Immanuel Lutheran Church, 7512 Ocean Gateway (Rt. 50), Easton, MD 21601, on Wednesday, June 5, 2013 at 2:00 pm. A luncheon will follow the service in the fellowship hall.

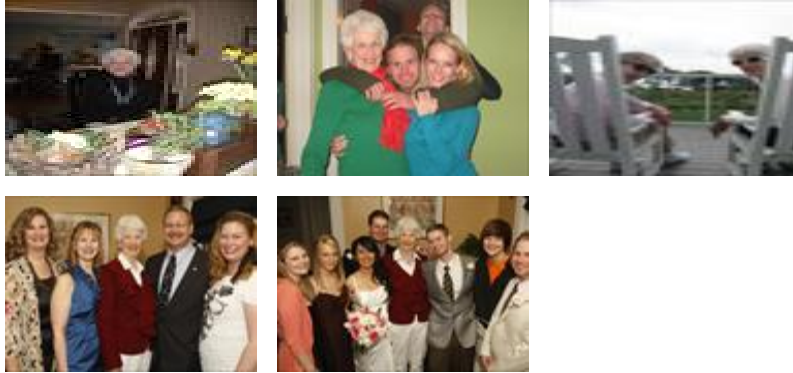
