



## Mary Armentrout

January 26, 1921 - August 17, 2011

Mary L. Armentrout of Pittsville formerly of Oxford died on Wednesday, August 17, 2011 at the Salisbury Rehabilitation and Nursing Center. She was 90. Born on January 26, 1921 in St. Michaels, she was the daughter of the late Giles H. and Mary E. Marshall Jump. After graduating from St. Michaels High School in 1937; she began working at McCrory's where she remained until 1949. After leaving McCrory's, she then worked for Fox's Clothing Store for a brief time until taking a position at the Delmarva Narrow Fabrics Ribbon Plant in 1954 where she remained for fourteen years. She then returned to Fox's where she worked fourteen years until retiring in 1983. On July 29, 1938 she married Allen Greenhawk, who died on July 20, 1940; she later married her second husband, Robert L. Armentrout on June 15, 1941, who died on June 2, 1996.

She was a former member of the Easton Church of God.

Mrs. Armentrout is survived by a daughter: Marjorie Armentrout Morris of Pittsville, five grandchildren, nine great-grandchildren, and two great great grandchildren. In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her first husband, Allen Greenhawk; as well as, her second husband, Robert L. Armentrout, a daughter Mary Patricia Marshall, four brothers, one grandson, one granddaughter, one great grandson, and one great granddaughter, A funeral service will be held on Thursday, August 25, 2011 at the Fellows, Helfenbein & Newnam Funeral Home, P.A. at 11:00 am.
