Mary Thelma Bryant of Easton, MD, passed away on Monday, July 7, 2014. She was 85. She was born July 11, 1928, in Lynemouth, Northumberland England, the daughter of the late Thomas and Elizabeth Mounsey.

She moved to London in her early teens, where she spent many nights in the underground railways during the Battle of Britain. When Mary was eighteen, she proudly served in the Royal Air Force as a cook on various air bases throughout England. One of her proudest moments was when she was asked to be Winston Churchill's cook at his summer home. She declined the offer and instead married the love of her life, Stanley C. Bryant, who passed away on August 30, 2006.

In 1961, she immigrated to the U.S. with her husband and two children, where she lived in Massachusetts and Maryland.

Mary enjoyed knitting, playing bingo, and cooking. Her pride and joy were her grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

She is survived by her daughter, Deborah L. Cawley of Oxford, MD; her grandchildren, Robert R. Hartkopf (Jill) of PA, Andrea Cawley Frey (Daryl) of Trappe, MD, Elisabeth Green of Wittman, MD, and Colin Bryant of Atlanta, GA; her great-grandchildren, Trevor and Alexander Green of Oxford, MD,
