Mary Hardin Getsinger of Easton, MD, passed away peacefully on July 13, 2020.

Beloved wife of the late Richard (Dick) Getsinger, Mary is survived by her children, Rebecca Mulholland (Stephen) and J. Matthew Getsinger (Amanda); stepchildren: Richard Getsinger, Jr., Ann Carroll (Dennis), and James Getsinger; her 10 cherished grandchildren, Daniel, Kathleen, and Molly Getsinger, Brian and Kevin Carroll, Katherine and Charles Mulholland, and Grace, Jack, and Matthew Getsinger; and her brother Charles Hardin (Judy).

Mary was born on May 17, 1933, in Bardwell, KY, but grew up in primarily in Florida. After graduating from Miami Edison High School, she left Florida for the great adventure of living and working in Washington, DC.
