August 18, 1933 - September 28, 2014

Mary Hundley Hyatt of Easton, MD, passed peacefully September 28, 2014, at Talbot Hospice House. She was born in Suffolk, VA, on August 18, 1933, the daughter of the late Walter R. Hundley and Willie J. Hundley.
