Mary Lynn Jordan died on Friday, August 15, 2014, at University of MD Shore Medical Center at Easton. She was 66.

Mary Jordan was born on November 7, 1947, in Easton, MD. She was the daughter of the late Calvin C. Covington and Doris J. McClintock Covington. Mary graduated from North Caroline High School. She also attended Goldy Beacom for two years. She married Simmie W. Jordan in October of 1970. Mary worked at Black & Decker in Easton for 28 years and most recently worked as a medical receptionist.

Mary was a member of the Ridgely United Methodist Church, Bridgetown United Methodist Church, and Thawley United Methodist Church, where she played piano and sang in the choir for all three churches. She also was a member of the Queen Anne's Chorale.

Mary is survived by her children, Aaron Scott Jordan of Queen Anne, MD, and Yvonne Jordan Pickle of Dover, DE, fiancé Ken Vaneman of Queenstown, MD; siblings, Karin Coward of Easton, MD, Barbara Brown of Milford, DE, and John Covington of Salisbury, MD; grandchildren, Bryan Brooks of Mooreville, NC, and Brianna Pickle of Dover, DE. In addition to her parents, she was predeceased by her husband, Simmie W. Jordan.

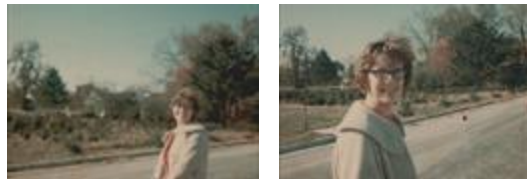
