Mary Rose Kimble of Chestertown, MD, died on Friday, November 27, 2009, at Chester River Hospital Center. She was 86.

Born in Pennsylvania, she was the daughter of the late William and Jane Murphy Moore. She graduated High School in PA and received her Associates Degree in Chemistry. In 1947, she married John Wesley Kimble and they lived in Cleveland, OH, where she worked at Sohio Petroleum Labs as a chemist.
